Team Time Trial Event: £25

- Swimmers aged 25 and older compete in both senior and masters categories. The positions in the masters category is based on an age adjusted time system.
- Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals awarded to North District club members on the basis of their position among North District competitors. Medals are awarded to other swimmers on the basis of their overall positions. This includes the team time trial event.
- ➤ Wetsuits will be compulsory if the water temperatures is below 18°C. For guidance see here.
- Swimmers who are not members of affiliated clubs can apply for temporary membership of SASA. See here for instructions and here to login to the system.
- Closing Date for Entries: Noon 14th August 2024.

Team Time Trial Information

- 1 The team time trial will be held over 3 circuits of a 500 metre course.
- 2 Each team must contain at least 2 female swimmers.
- 3 Teams will be started at 30 second intervals.

- 4 At the end of the first circuit the leading swimmer in each team will retire leaving three swimmers to continue.
- 5 At the end of the second circuit the leading swimmer in each team will retire leaving two swimmers to continue.
- 6 The time for the team will be that of the second swimmer crossing the finish line at the end of the third circuit.

Entries

Bulk club entries including the team time trial event should be made on the spreadsheet available to download from here.

Conditions & Notes:

- 1 The Organisers reserve the right not to accept entries from swimmers who they believe may not be capable to completing the event within the cut off time.
- 2 Swimmers will be required to wear caps provided.
- 3 By entering this event you agree to become registered as an open water swimmer on the SASA membership database.
- 4 Temporary members will be entitled to prize in the open categories but not in the North District Categories.
- 5 The masters event is determined using a system to adjust times based on the age of the competitors. Competitors in the masters event are also included in the senior category.
- 6 Competitors should be aware that swimming in open water events brings with it a small risk of contracting leptospirosis (Weil's disease) and that they should contact their doctor if they feel ill in the days after the event.
- 7 Teams will be required to complete a form declaring the names and registration numbers of their members.
- 8 Members of teams who are not competing in individual events will be required to complete a medical questionnaire on the day of the championships.
- 9 Entries received after noon on 14th August are unlikely to be accepted and will be at the discretion of SASA North District.
- 10. The Scottish Swimming Transgender & Non-Binary Competition Policy will be implemented nationally across all aquatics sports since 1st January 2024. The policy and FAQs can be found here. Any policy related matters that arise during the event should be reported to and will be recorded by the Meet Convenor/Chief Referee and these matters will be communicated to and managed post event by the relevant Scottish Swimming Staff. At no point will members be challenged on the day of a competition with any matters being resolved post event. By entering the Female category, athletes are therefore confirming their birth sex is female and are eligible to compete in the Female category.
